

Santa María

Las Brujas, Ensenachos and Santa María stand out among the whimsical group of islets that surround the northeastern coast of Villa Clara, with incredible shades ranging from green to blue, in addition to an endemic flora and fauna.

The key is accessed through a 48-kilometer highway over the sea, which was awarded the “Puente de Alcántara” International Prize for the Best Ibero-American Civil Work for its special care for the environment in its layout and execution, in an area declared a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO since 2000.





Las Brujas is the first of these cays, and its coastline is occupied by a magnificent 2 km-long beach and has one of the most beautiful coral reefs of the island.



SANTA MARÍA




Santa María is the last and largest of the cays, also known as “the White Rose of the King’s Gardens”. Its northern coast has extensive beaches (just over 10 km) of fine white sand and crystal clear waters, surrounded by a hotel infrastructure that is harmoniously integrated into

the environment. It is the habitat of numerous plant species, among which the flamingos, gulls, pelicans, hawks, iguanas, bats and other endemic subspecies stand out. They are all preserved at Santa María Cay Wildlife Refuge.


**Flora and Fauna








SANTA CLARA



The search for fertile land for livestock and agriculture led to the founding of Santa Clara town on July 15th, 1689 by 176 people, belonging to 18 families from Remedios. The first mass was celebrated at the foot of a tamarind. Over time, on May 12th, 1867, by order of Her Majesty, the Queen Isabel II, the town became the city of Santa Clara, which treasures events that make it unique, unrepeatable and always

enthralling. The small elevation between the Sabana and Monte rivers (Bélico and Cubanicy), today occupied by El Carmen Park and its urban environment, is the site of the commemorative monument that was built in 1951 around the tamarind where the founding mass was celebrated.

Commander Ernesto Guevara Sculptural Complex

It was inaugurated on December 28th, 1988 on the occasion of the 30th anniversary of Santa Clara battle. In the Memorial erected in his honor, Santa Clara jealously guards the remains of the Heroic Guerilla fighter and those of several internationalist fighters of his guerilla in Bolivia.

The Sculptural Complex is made up of the Square, the Tribune, the Museum, the Memorial and the Las Villas Front Mausoleum. The mausoleum was inaugurated on October 8th, 2009, to honor and guard the remains of the fighters of Las Villas Front.

The tribune is made up of five elements, the most fundamental is Che's bronze sculpture, which stands on a 16-meter high pedestal (10 of them visible and stone-covered, and 6 meters of green marble on the ground floor). The statue is 6.80 meters high and weighs 20 tons.

Among the most beautiful sculptures of Commander Ernesto Guevara, and one of the most visited in Santa Clara, we find that of Che with a child in his arms, located at the entrance to the building occupied by the Provincial Party Committee in Villa Clara, former guerrilla command during the Battle of Santa Clara. The real-size sculpture is the work of the Basque sculptor Casto Solano Marroyo and it is a recognition of the human values and honesty of Che.





Loma del Capiro Monument

Loma del Capiro, Capiro neighborhood. Santa Clara

This natural elevation, declared a National Monument in 1990, was a

strategic point for the definitive liberation of Santa Clara, which led to the victory of the Rebel Army. At the highest point, about 176.5 meters, there is a sculpture by José Delarra conceived with the union of different calibers of firearms directed towards the sky and joined by a ring to reaffirm the defense of the country. From there, the best views of the city are offered.

Armored Train Monument and Museum



It is a monument-museum that recalls the derailment action of a railway convoy of Batista's Army led by the Che's rebel troops on December 29th,

1958, which was a highly crucial action for the liberation of Santa Clara city. The artistic conception of the monument belongs to José Delarra, who tried to represent, through five sculptural elements, the different actions of the rebel platoon. It includes four original wagons, photos, plans, sketches of the guerrilla positions and an old bulldozer of transcendent importance in the battle.





ATTRACTIONS

Leoncio Vidal Caro Park

Cuba, Colón, Máximo Gómez and Luis Estévez Streets, Santa Clara.

It owes its name to a distinguished Cuban patriot of our wars of independence. During its first years it became Plaza de Armas. Throughout

time it has been a place for religious cults, mercantile activities, and constitutional celebrations; and nowadays it has been declared a National Monument. It is the center of the social and cultural life of Santa Clara city. Its architectural environment is eclectic with neoclassical features.



Monument to Marta Abreu de Estévez

It was unveiled in 1924, in honor of the illustrious benefactor of the city. It was paid with funds collected by the people and it was placed where the bell tower of the Major Church previously stood up, straight to the Arbor and the Obelisk.



Fountain of the Unfortunate Boy with the Boot


This fountain has an ornamental function and was placed in 1925 during the foundation of the park. The original fountain was destroyed in 1969 and 20 years later, a cast bronze replica was made by the artist José Delarra, a copy of admirable fidelity to the original.

The Arbor

It was built in 1911, at the place chosen as the center for the total restoration of the park in the first half of the last century. It continues to be a space reserved for the municipal band and a stage where the Cuban danzón is danced many evenings.

Across from Vidal Park, we find this big house from the second half of the 18th century, the oldest in the area. It has a central courtyard and several rooms, where decorative objects and furniture of neoclassical style as well as those of the colonial mansions of the 18th and 19th centuries are exhibited. It houses a concert hall that offers an attractive program starring excellent musicians.


works. It is considered one of the best preserved 19th-century coliseums in Cuba. Famous national and foreign artists have performed on its stage. It is one of the most outstanding buildings in Santa Clara city for its architectural values. It has valuable easel paintings on the false ceiling of the main room, as well as sculptures and wall paintings in the lobby.



Martí Provincial Library

Vidal Park, corner Buen Viaje, Santa Clara.

Built in the early 20th century, it was the old seat of government and the place where General Máximo Gómez addressed the people from Santa Clara in 1899 as he passed through this region. So did Fidel in his victorious move to the west. It was also the first place of the posthumous homage to Che and his comrades when their remains arrived to Santa Clara. Currently, the provincial library has several rooms for studying and reading, an exhibition space and a concert hall.

Just half an hour away from Santa Clara, the eighth village founded by the Spaniards in 1515 seems frozen in time. San Juan de los Remedios, over 500 years old, treasures a very well-preserved historical center, which has its starting point at José Martí

square. Wide halls in the form of corridors, wrought iron grilles and large eaves supported by wooden corbels, which protect walkers from the intensity of the sun, are abundant in its architecture.





Parrandas Remedianas

San Juan de los Remedios is popularly known for its incomparable Parrandas, a legendary cultural event that takes place every December 24th since 1820.

The neighborhoods of Carmen and San Salvador, with the emblems of El Gavilán (Sparrowhawk) and El Gallo (Rooster), respectively, will keep secret their plans for their floats and lanterns until the opening day of the parties. Their neighbors then become fraternal contenders and the flags of both teams are raised in front of the cortege and accompanying the congas.

Every year, this event attracts hundreds of Cubans and foreigners because of the colorfulness of their floats, the unmistakable sound of trumpets and the sweeping pace of the changüí, which along the fireworks adorn a city that does not sleep.

Similar events started to take place throughout the central region of the country, which encouraged UNESCO to officially recognize them as Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity on November 2018.



PLACES OF INTEREST



San Juan Bautista Parochial Church

Máximo Gómez Street, corner José Peña, Remedios.

It is one of the most significant churches in Cuba, a symbol of the Catholic tradition inherited from the Spaniards of the colonial era. Its current

neoclassical tower was built between 1848 and 1858 by the French architect Louis Rolland.

The temple reaches out its distinguished beauty in the 18th century. Its most attractive feature is the elaborate altarpiece and its golden lamination, which extends to the two lateral altars, together with its beautiful Catholic images and the decorated gabled ceilings.

Museum of Parrandas

Located very close to the historic center of the city and founded on April 1st, 1980 this museum exhibits photos, models, costumes, headdresses, musical instruments, lanterns, fireworks, flags, banners, party symbols of the neighborhoods El Gallo (San Salvador) and Gavilán and La Globa (Carmen), and pieces of floats, which visitors can appreciate in its seven rooms.





José Martí Park

José Martí Park constitutes the center of this legendary city and the place from where the tangled urban fabric started. Today it gathers demonstrative buildings from bygone eras such as the houses of Alférez Real, Rojas, Lobatón and Pangua's families, among others. In this square flanked by beautiful flamboyant trees, the silhouettes of the bell towers of the San Juan Bautista Parochial Church and the Buen Viaje Church stand out. Both churches are placed on both sides of the square, a very unique case in Cuba.



Alejandro García Caturla Music Museum

It is the residence where the famous Cuban musician Alejandro García Caturla was born. It was built in 1875, in front of the main square of this city. The place stands out for its tiles and it preserves the atmosphere of its main

pieces and the original structure of the colonial houses. Its three rooms embrace an extraordinary collection of manuscripts by the eminent composer, revolutionary and one of the first to introduce African rhythms in the Cuban music of his time. The house became a museum on May 31st, 1975, with the purpose of developing musical interest and raising the cultural level of our people, as well as stimulating the study of Caturla's work.



Former Acevedo's pharmacy, it was transformed into a store for drinks, spirits, wines, Cuban coffee, handicrafts, and cigars, all of national manufacture. Havana cigars, rum and coffee, the three kings of the market, come together in the same store with the same name, which also offers coffee, drinks and soft drinks. You can see how tobacco is manually made. The place also has an exclusive area for smokers.

This statue, unique in the country, stands out very close to Martí Park, although it is not exactly the same as its American namesake.



Visit to the museum of the sugar industry in Cuba, formerly Marcelo Salado Agroindustrial Complex. It hoards components and parts of the industry from the first years to the present day, and the locomotive workshop is a special place where there are 38 steam machines

preserved in perfect conditions. 

SAGUA LA GRANDE




It is located on the northern plain of Villa Clara and it is part of a wide stretch of flat land between Jumagua mountains and the sea. It owes its name to Sagua la Grande river, which runs through its fields crossing the city.

The official foundation of the city occurred on December 8th, 1812. From then on, the population experienced a rapid growth and development. It acquired the status of industrial city during the Republic, and in 1958 it was considered "the second industrial city" after Havana. Today the city retains the neoclassical spirit of its urban planning and architecture, with few modern changes to its historic center. For these reasons, the historic center of Sagua la Grande was declared a National Monument on December 6th, 2011.

The Triumph Bridge

The passage of goods and people between one side and the other of the city was not a simple task in its first century of existence. For this reason, boats were used from different docks along the river. The iron bridge was

built in 1905 after the destruction of the old wooden bridge, due to the frequent flooding of Sagua river. Currently, given its advanced state of deterioration, its restoration is included in the development plans of a city for which The Triumph Bridge is its cultural symbol.




