It is located in the Río Canímar Valley, 4.5 km from the city of Matanzas

In this area 12 archaeological sites are located: one of the most important is the aboriginal cemetery, the oldest of the Greater Antilles, declared National Monument.

A wide variety of recreational options are provided: boat, water bikes, kayaks rentals, horse riding, bull riding, archery, hiking, boat trips, wildlife observation and an aboriginal show, which, together with a wide gastronomic offer, that complement an unforgettable experience.

Saturn's Cave

An underground gallery flooded 150m in length and more than 20 feet deep, constituting an ideal setting for diving caving. The experience is complemented with the realization of Snorkeling in Coral Beach.

El Morrillo Museum

It is built in the year 1720. Building erected a few meters from the mouth of the Canímar River, was part of the City's defensive belt to protect against attacks by privateers and pirates, seat of a customs register and naval apostarium, today is a Memorial Museum and National Monument.





Yumurí Valley

Landscape complex of high national significance in which nature and architecture merge. It retains archaeological remains and the endemic plant species Melocactus matanzanus.

In human view, the Yumurí Valley is an exceptional conjunction that forces, if not to visit it, at least to stop along the way to contemplate it from the "Bacunayagua" viewpoint, very close to the highest bridge on the Island, with an elevation of 110 meters, which is one of the wonders of Cuban civil engineering. q



San Severino Castle

It was the first and most important building in Matanzas City since its foundation. Typical Renaissance military construction, it conformed the defensive system of the city, and contains a set of historical, architectural and functional values that made it worthy of the status of National Monument in 1978.

It is currently the headquarters of the Slave Route Museum in the Caribbean, a museum that shows the history of the fortress and the legacy of slavery in Cuba.



Junco Palace Museum

Construction of the year 1838 and exponent of the neoclassical style in Cuba. Since 1980, this facility opened its doors, treasuring valuable objects, among which are: the oldest lapidary piece of Matanzas, the toll bar with which the Bellamar Caves were discovered, belongings of the poet Bonifacio Byrne and the only Cuban mummy exhibited in a museum.

Palmar de Junco Stadium

Headquarters of the first official baseball game held in Cuba on December 27, 1874, it has been a national monument since 1991 and is considered the oldest active baseball stadium in the world. Also exhibits since 2016 the Matanzas Baseball Hall of Fame. Guided tour is offered, visit to the history room and interaction with young and renowned athletes.

Bellamar Caves

Considered the oldest active tourist center in Cuba, it was declared a National Monument in 1987. This cave system was discovered in 1861 by chance when a slave lost his tool bar. Treasure a set of caverns of more than 23 kilometers of galleries. In its interior there are many crystallizations among which stands out the known as "The mantle of Columbus", a stalactite of 32 centuries of life, the largest and oldest formation that occurs in the form of a waterfall, with 12m high.

Triolet Pharmaceutical Museum

Built for pharmacy and opened in 1882, it was owned by Dr. Ernesto Triolet. In May 1964, it opened its doors as the first pharmaceutical museum in Latin America. Currently, it retains all the original elements and is the only French apothecary of the late nineteenth century that remains in the world. It was declared a National Monument since November 2007.

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Vigía Square

It constitutes the founding nucleus of the city and its first square. The city grew around it, where high-value buildings such as the Sauto Theater, the Junco Palace Museum and the Firefighters Museum, among others, remain.

Liberty park

Located in the historic center, it constitutes the second most important square in the city. Since 1909 in the center a distinguished sculptural group has been built: a sculpture that represents the Statue of Liberty symbolized by a woman with broken chains in her hands and crowning the scene, the sculpture of the most important founding father of Cuba, José Martí. It is surrounded by prominent facilities such as the White concert hall, the Pharmaceutical Museum and the Velasco and Louvre hotels.

Firemen's Museum

The Matanzas Fire Station was inaugurated on February 2, 1873. Manufactured in stonework and inspired by neoclassical architecture, it is one of the most attractive buildings of its type in Cuba. The institution, the first of its kind in Cuba as well as a fire station, is a museum, it holds hundreds of museum pieces, including objects and documents belonging to the different stages of its history.
